A Note from Pastor Tim

So, what now? That is the big question on anyone's mind who has just come through a season of life. No doubt, Wayne Street has come through a season of life.

All the paperwork has been signed and fees have been paid in full for us to no longer be affiliated with the United Methodist Church as of July 1. It breaks my heart that it has come to this point, but circumstances brought us here. That means we need to be asking ourselves that fateful question: so, what now?

Wayne Street is doing well these days. It has been so good to see so many people on Sunday mornings. To all of you who prioritize being here, thank you so much, and to those of you who keep up with what is happening online, thank you for making that effort. We are currently on a year long sermon series on Jesus, and I have really been enjoying working up some familiar and some not so familiar passages for sermons. I hope you have enjoyed hearing them as much as I have enjoyed preparing them.

But there is more going on than just worship. By now, you have received an email or a text from me about opportunities to serve the mission of this congregation. You have also heard me talk about it on Sunday mornings. For those of you who are not tech savvy, if you know how to use a pencil, we have forms for you to fill out. If you are looking for job descriptions for specific roles that we need, you will find them in this newsletter.

Please take some time and read through these possible ways to serve. I ask you pray about whether or not there is a need that you may be able to fulfill for YOUR church. Not everyone is called to fill all of these roles, but there is a specific place for everyone. Instead of me going around and pushing things on people, I wanted to put it out there and allow the Holy Spirit to put these ministry teams together for us.

All of these teams will need a lead person and there may be some specific roles on each team that will need to be filled. If you have any questions about any of these roles and responsibilities, please feel free to contact me. Also, I have no confidence whatsoever that I managed to come up with the entire list of teams we will need because we will run into challenges and opportunities that none of us could possibly foresee. But this gives us a place to start.

Ministry is meant to be owned by all of the body of Christ and our goal as an organization is to help everyone feel a sense of ownership here. Our job is big and our calling is bold, and we will be far more effective in fulfilling that calling if we have as many people own the calling as possible.

Please prayerfully and seriously consider getting involved.

WAYNE STREET ADMINISTRATION STRUCTURE

A letter from Pastor Tim:

I know it is no secret to any of you that administration is not my strong suit. It has never been my strength because my style is to shoot first and ask questions later. Committees don't do that. Committees exist to make sure nothing ever changes. Given the vote from March 19, 2023 being 124-18 to disaffiliate from the UMC, I believe change is our mandate. The people of Wayne Street want something different and doing something different is something no committee has ever done.

Our new administration structure needs to do a couple of things. First, it needs to be more transparent. I take full responsibility for that. Since the COVID overreaction, I have gotten more and more cynical and that has led me to not take the flow of information seriously. To anyone who ever reads this document, I am sorry for that. Under my tenure, that will not happen again.

The second thing our new administration structure needs to do is incorporate more people. Since we will no longer have any committees (more on that in a moment), we are expanding what needs to be done by the leadership of this church. The bottom line is we need people involved. One of the big church growth movements of the 2000s and 2010s was the idea of streamlining administration. This was in response to the crushing administration coming out of the 80s and 90s. It took so long to make decisions that churches ground to a halt. That is where the BLT model of administration came from. The advantage is that since the BLT was all the committees at once, they could discuss and vote on items the same night. In theory, that was supposed to enable quick decision making. In practice, it meant that one person did the work of a whole committee and the BLT meetings became marathon meetings trying to both discuss, figure out, and then vote on issues. This is why I have been here for almost 5 years and the BLT has not discussed a single ministry item for my entire tenure. All of our meetings were used to discuss staff, building, and financial issues. These are things that should have been figured out prior to the BLT meeting and simply presented.

The way I would like to address these concerns is that I do not want a bunch of people sitting around a table discussing things. That is not in Wayne Street's best interest. What I want to create are small groups of people who are responsible for accomplishing goals. Do they have to make decisions about certain areas? Of course, but making decisions is not the reason they exist. They exist to accomplish the solution, not decide what the solution is.

Listed in the following pages are the job descriptions of these groups:

WAYNE STREET ADMINISTRATION STRUCTURE



Lead Team – Our leadership team will no longer be named after a sandwich.

1) This is the equivalent of the administrative council in the old system. This group serves one purpose: to hold the other groups accountable. They also have the final say on major decisions.

What qualifies as a major decision?

- Anything costing more than \$2500
- Anything relating to employment of a staff member
- Approval of and accountability for the annual budget
- Approval of people to serve on this or any other group
- Any major change in appearance of function of the building
- Appoint a point person to each of the following groups
- 2) Responsible to keep the congregation informed.
- 3) Meet on an as needed basis.
 - Email decisions are allowed and encouraged
 - Meetings will be held at the discretion of the participants
- 4) People eligible to serve in this or any of the following groups:
 - Active participants in the life of the congregation for at least 6 months.
 - Terms will last for 1 year and no one can serve more than three consecutive terms

Grounds and Maintenance – This group will be responsible for the physical building.

1) Made up of people who have a desire to maintain this building so it is ready for ministry

2) This group will be able to perform routine maintenance and repairs up to \$2500 so long as the following two stipulations are met:

- The budget for the maintenance or repair has funds that have been approved by the lead team.
- The maintenance and repair will not fall under the jurisdiction of the lead team (by being a major change in appearance of function of the building).

3) This group will only ever meet in one of two circumstances.

- There is a specific need that must be addressed
- There is something that needs to be done to make the building ready for ministry
- All other decisions made by this group can and will be made via email

Congregational Care –A group of people who will provide care for our community

- 1) This group will be made up of people to care for the community in the following ways.
 - Sending out cards for any reason
 - Home/hospital/nursing home visits
 - Determine if and when a pastoral visit might be in order.
 - Keeping the office informed of prayer requests and other needs.

2) This group may never meet together as a group, but they will inform the point person from the lead team of the people under their care.



<u>Staff Care</u> – A group who watches over the staff.

1) This group will be liaisons who will have frequent contact with each staff member both in person and electronically.

- 2) Each liaison will be assigned by the lead team and will report to the lead team point person
 - Liaisons will be recruited and vetted by the lead team. Their job is very important in that they exist to make sure the staff people do not live on an island. They listen to their concerns, provide feedback, and encourage staff. When necessary, they report back to the lead team but there is an expectation of confidentiality to this position.
 - This group will make recommendations to the lead team about time off, salaries, bonuses, and other needs and concerns of the staff.




Mission – A group who oversees the mission budget and organizes events to engage the congregation in mission.

1) This group will oversee the areas of mission that include the four areas outlined by Jesus in Acts 1:8: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere---in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

- Jerusalem Local mission within the city of St Marys
- Judea Mission within the State of Ohio
- Samaria National mission throughout the United States
- The ends of the earth Overseas mission
- 2) These mission priorities will be supplied with manpower and financial support.
 - The mission team is responsible to delegate these resources out in the most efficient and effective way possible.



- **Finance** A group who oversee our financial wellbeing
- 1) This group will prepare and present the annual budget to the Lead Team
- 2) Provide reports to the Lead Team of giving vs expenses.
- 3) Made decision about any endowments or investments that may arise.



- 1) Take ownership of all of Children's ministry grades pre-K to 4th grade
- 2) Evaluate and improve Sunday morning and Wednesday evening children's ministry.



Youth Ministry – the group that supports our Youth ministry director to recruit volunteers and oversee education and ministry to children.

- 1) Take ownership of all of Youth ministry grades 5-12
- 2) Evaluate and improve Sunday morning and Wednesday evening Youth ministry.



Worship Planning – This group will work with the Pastor and music directors to plan and execute Sunday morning services

- 1) This group will assist in offering high quality worship services to our congregation
- 2) Meet quarterly to plan worship services and special events
 - Provide communion servicers
 - Make sure the sound booth and computer are working properly (HUGE strain off of your pastor and worship leaders)

Once again this year we will be celebrating Christmas in July for Operation Christmas Child.

The Mission Team is asking the congregation to donate money for the shipping of the Wayne Street Church shoeboxes throughout the month of July. Our goal is to collect \$5,000.00 to cover the cost of shipping 500 shoebox gifts. **Please mark your donation for OCC shipping.**

We are also going to try something new this year. The children's ministry plans to pack 75 shoeboxes. **On July 9 and July 16 between services we will make some crafts with the children to include in their shoeboxes.** Please join the children to help with this activity and support the ministry of Operation Christmas Child.

Operation Christmas Child is sharing the Good News with unreached people groups. One example is the Himba people in Namibia. Working with the Seed Company of Wycliffe Bible Translators, more than 80 Bible stories including the Gospel of Mark and The Greatest Journey material were translated. Since the Himba have a predominantly oral culture, these stories were distributed on hundreds of solar-powered MP3 players. Now there is a growing number of believers among this unreached people group.




